SHORT BIOGRAPHIES OF GUEST-SPEAKERS

Laurence Mc Cullagh was appointed Development manager by Ilex Urban Regeneration Company Ltd, the company charged with delivery of the regeneration of the Derry City Council Area in Northern Ireland, in August 2008. His particular remit within the company is managing the regeneration and redevelopment of two former military sites in the city, totalling 40 acres. Prior to his appointment to llex Laurence was ,for 18 years, General Manager of Inner City Trust the voluntary organisation widely credited with the economic and social regeneration of the historic walled city of Derry which was seriously damaged by civil unrest and a sustained bombing campaign during the 1980's. Laurence also has development experience with the housing and education authorities in Northern Ireland and remains actively involved in local community organisations.

Kyle M. Alexander OBE, Strategic Advisor, Strategic Investment Board Ltd. As Strategic Advisor on Urban Regeneration with the SIB, Kyle draws on thirty years' public and private sector experience in the planning and delivery of regeneration. In January 2007 he received an OBE for services to regeneration in Northern Ireland. He was formerly Director of Development and then Chief Executive of Laganside Corporation, the urban development corporation responsible for the transformation of Belfast's waterfront. Prior to this, Kyle was involved in inner city housing redevelopment in Belfast with the Northern Ireland Housing Executive. He has a particular interest in area based approaches to planning and delivery of regeneration that focus on both 'people and place'. Kyle is a board member of INTA, the international urban development association and CABERNET, the European brownfield regeneration network. He has been a member of international panels advising cities in Latvia, Japan and Taiwan on development policy and practice. He is a Member of the Royal Town Planning Institute.

Tony Monaghan, Urban Planner, Regeneration Officer at the Development Department of Derry City Council. He is involved in a varied range of economic development, tourism infrastructure and physical regeneration projects including a selection of specific projects relating to the Walled City of Derry Signature Tourism Project. Tony is a chartered town planner having graduated from the University of Newcastle upon Tyne, England, with a Masters Degree in Town Planning. Prior to taking up his current position with Derry City Council in 2001, Tony was employed as a Development Control Planner with local authorities in London and south east England.

Lisa Martin is Economic Development Manager with Belfast City Council, the largest local authority in Northern Ireland. Lisa has been working with Belfast City Council since 2002. Her current portfolio includes business development support activities for small businesses, actions to promote access to employment among those most excluded from the job market and coordination of activities to promote the city as an investment location. Lisa previously managed a programme to promote physical and environmental regeneration activities in targeted areas across Belfast. Previous to joining Belfast City Council, Lisa worked as External Relations Officer with Leeds City Council (UK) and as Policy Officer with the Northern Ireland Centre in Europe - Northern Ireland's regional office in Brussels. Lisa holds a Masters degree in Local Economic Development and is currently studying for a Masters degree in Public Administration.

Seán Brennan MABA(Hons) PG dip Avd Dip. Seán Brennan is the Senior Development Officer in the Intercomm-led Developing Leadership Initiative Community Empowerment Partnership. Seán develops accredited and non-accredited transformative learning opportunities for local community leaders in North Belfast's interface communities. Seán works directly with local community leaders, Minister's, Govt Dept's and local elected representatives active in peace building and regeneration across North Belfast. Seán is currently a member of the North Belfast Community Empowerment Network, Belfast City Council's Good Relations Partnership and the Northern Ireland Foundation.

Tim Losty is the Director of the North Belfast Community Action Unit, taking up the position in March 2008. Prior to this Tim spent 4 years in Washington DC as the Director of the Northern Ireland Bureau representing the Executive's interests throughout the US. Before going to America Tim worked for LEDU and later Invest NI with responsibility for developing new businesses, helping them into export markets and also worked on local economic regeneration programmes. Tim was a founder member of the Belfast Peace and Reconciliation Partnership Board in 1994; a Director of the Belfast Local Strategy Board; the East Belfast Partnership; and the First Stop Business Shop. Tim also worked on the West Belfast and Greater Shankill Taskforces set up by Ministers and local politicians to address specific issues of disadvantage in the community. Educated at St Mary's Grammar School, Belfast, Tim has an honours degree in Political Science from Queens University, Belfast, a Post Graduate Diploma in Marketing, and a Master of Science in Business Improvement from the University of Ulster. Professional Qualifications include a Diploma from the Chartered Institute of Marketing and a Diploma in Strategic Management from the Institute of Directors. He is a member and former Committee Member of the Chartered Institute of Marketing and a member of the Institute of Directors.

Kate Burns (Bsc.Hons. Msc.RD., Dip CDP) is Chairperson of Town and Country Homes, the largest Irish B&B organisation with over 1000 members and an annual turnover in excess of €9 million. She is a Senior Partner with Management Consultants First Western and prior to that was the Chief Executive of the Irish Central Border Area Network (ICBAN) from 2002 to 2007. ICBAN is a partnership of local politicians and social partners from ten council areas in the border region of Ireland/Northern Ireland and implementing agent for measures of the INTERREG IIIA Programme. Kate has held numerous Directorships including on the Executive of the Association of European Border Regions, Vice Chair of the Northern Ireland Rural Housing Association. Kate is on the Board of Failte Ireland North West and on the Executive of the Irish Tourism Industry Confederation. Kate has extensive experience in cross border policy and development work, strategic planning and project development in tourism, rural and economic development. Previous positions include Manager of Bryson House Urban Environmental Unit Belfast, Economic Development Manager, Coleraine Borough Council and Manager the Coleraine LEADER Programme. Kate spent much of her earlier life on Rathlin Island where she ran a restaurant and 'Rathlin Interpretive Tours'. Kate is a mother of four sons, a keen musician, environmentalist and sailor with a passion for all things maritime.
