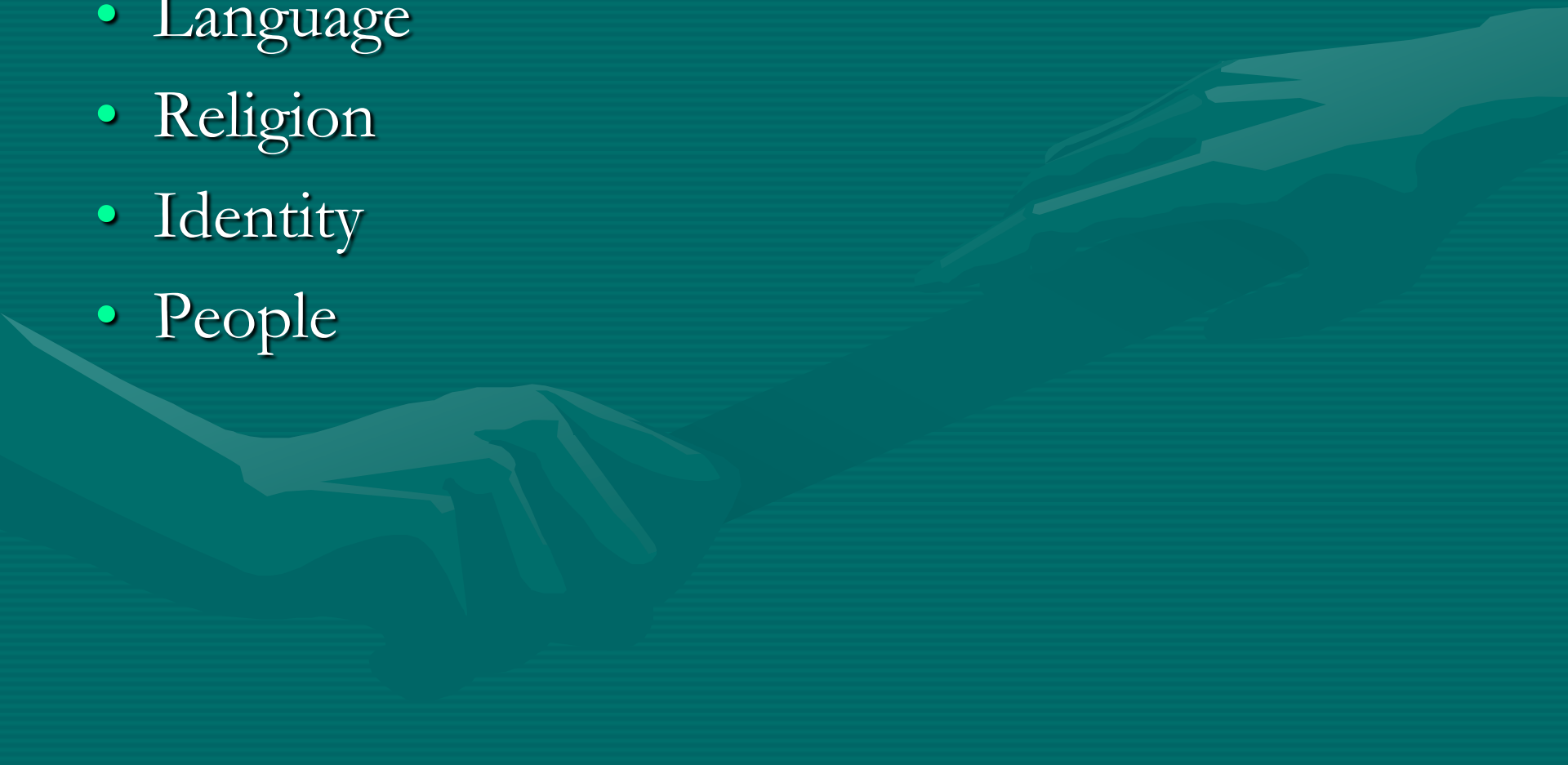

IWVG 10 Point Plan

- Create a pool of North Belfast detached youth/interface outreach workers
- The development of a specific fund to aid the delivery of inter-community activities and good relations work, with an emphasis upon interface issues and young people.
- The creation of an Interface/Youth Providers Forum
- The creation of a Youth Work Training Programme
- Highlight the best practice adopted in reducing interface violence and conflict amelioration achieved recently around parading
- A pilot study area for A Shared Future of a Good Relations Development Officer should be considered to work with the North Belfast Interface Working Group in order to create and promote good relations within communities.
- Pilot social economy project
- The notion of re-imagining communities should be taken forward by the North Belfast Interface Working Group in order to improve physical environment and explore the use of murals, flags and symbols.
- North Belfast Interface Working Group should be supported with regard to the production of a scoping exercise based upon identifying the nature and meaning of contested space as well as inter and intra community conflict within North Belfast.
